





María Verónica San Martín:

DIGNIDAD.

An exhibition and performance based on secret telephone documents on Colonia Dignidad in collaboration with The National Archives of Chile, The Association of Memory and Human Rights on Colonia Dignidad and the lawyer Winfried Hempel.



Colonia Dignidad was a hidden community in Southern Chile founded by Nazis who managed to hide themselves there after WWII. During the Pinochet dictatorship, the regime's intelligent forces used it as a crucial site for clandestine operations, in collaboration with the CIA and Nazi officers. At least 300 people were tortured and close to 100 people were executed without trial at the site alone. Many of the bodies have still not been located.

You'll experience sculpture, performance, text, original files from Chile's National Archives (where the project was exhibited this year,), and the audio of recording that reveals the secret operations between Nazi agents in Peru, Germany, and Chile, the audio of previously unreleased tapes from one of the survivors, now a lead lawyer in a human rights case currently being prosecuted in Chile.

María Verónica San Martín is a Chilean-born, New York-based artist working in printmaking, artist books, installations, sculpture, and performance art. San Martín addresses memory as a pivotal factor for the understanding of the neoliberal, globalized present, turning recently to the subject matter of the Chilean dictatorship's violence (1973-1990), vis-à-vis the United States and Nazism's involvement in that violence. She was a studio artist at The Whitney Museum Independent Study Program (2017-2018), a scholar at The New York Center for Book Arts (2016-2017) and an artist in residence at Art OMI in Ghent, NY (2016). She has had solo and group exhibitions at The National Archive of Chile (2018); Artists Space, NYC, (2018); BRIC Arts Media, NY (2017); The Bayerische Staatsbibliothek, Germany (2016), The Cantor Art Center, Stanford University, CA (2015); The Museum of Memory and Human Rights, Chile (2013) and is currently exhibiting Dignidad at The Center for Book Arts in New York City (2019). She is a recipient of two Fondart grants from the cultural council of Chile. Her work can be found in more than 45 international collections including The Metropolitan Museum of Art, The Pompidou Centre, The New York Public Library, The Walker Art Center, among others.
